



## CERTIFICATE OF CHRISTIAN TRAINING

The Certificate of Christian Training (CCT) is designed for students who desire to receive a basic religious foundation offered through non- credit courses at approved extension sites. CCT applicants are not required to have earned a high school diploma. However, it is recommended that CCT students have a tenth grade education. Upon completion of the course of study the student should:

- have a better concept of the background and message of the Bible;
- be better able to expound on, as well as live with, principles of the Christian faith;
- have a solid foundation in basic communication skills; and
- have a broader concept of the nature, purpose, and methodology of many aspects of church work.

Courses previously taken at another accredited institution may be used toward satisfying CCT course requirements.
